Accountability, Responsibility to Change (A.R.C.) Program

A behaviour change program for Aboriginal men, the Accountability, Responsibility to Change (A.R.C.) program works through a holistic family intervention response model. The program works to support the safety of women and children by working closely with the specialist homelessness and domestic violence services and the KWY Aboriginal family violence program.

The A.R.C. Program:

The A.R.C. Program is a behaviour change program for Aboriginal men that is set in a culturally safe environment to:

- Provide men with opportunities to consider the decisions they make, and the impact of their decisions.
- Hold men accountable and take responsibility for their behaviour.
- Reduce the incidence and impact of domestic and Aboriginal family violence in communities.
- Challenge attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours that allow violence and abuse to occur.

The A.R.C. behaviour change program is a service conducted with narrative therapy methodology, and is a part of the South Australia Intervention Order Response Model.
